Recycling Program & Waste Transfer Station

How do I sort it all?

Blue Bag # 1

Plastic Containers with lids removed.
Plastic Items #1-7

Food, beverage, metal & aluminum cans

- Rinse metal cans/lids and put lids inside the can before placing in the bag.

Aluminum foil wrap & trays

- Rinse, crumple foil, flatten trays, and place loose in bag

Milk cartons & juice boxes (remove straws)

- Rinse and flatten
- Place flattened cartons inside an open carton

Blue Bag # 2 (Fibres)

Newspapers, flyers, magazines, telephone books, game books, hardcover books (remove cover), egg cartons, toilet/paper towel core rolls, cereal boxes (remove liner), office paper, envelopes, paperbacks, household and fine paper.

Cardboard Boxes with a "corrugated" waffle

- Flatten, bundle, tie with string
- Place beside bags at the curb
- Pizza Boxes (clean)
- Maximum size (3'x 2'x 1')

We CANNOT accept the following items:

- styrofoam
- hazardous waste
- dishes
- container lids
- plastic bags or film
- Christmas wrapping paper
- waxed covered boxes, i.e. soap boxes



When in doubt, leave it out!

EVERY SECOND WEEK



If possible, place recyclables 1.5 meters (5 feet) away from your garbage cans at the curb.

WEEE - Recycling Electronics

WEEE stands for "Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment," as designated in Ontario Regulation 393/04. It is the informal name for the variety of electrical and electronic products that are no longer wanted by their owners. A variety of options exist for waste electronics, including reuse, refurbishment and recycling.

Glass Recycling Year Round

Household GLASS bottles and jars only, (no plate glass) is accepted at DEPOT ONLY (no curbside pick-up)

Refrigeration Tags

Refrigeration tags must be purchased by anyone disposing of an old refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner or dehumidifier (if compressor). Tags are available at the Town Hall for \$55.00. Appliances must be dropped off at the Waste Transfer Station during regular hours. Please affix sticker on the interior rear wall of the refrigerator.



Bag Tags

Bag tags are required for regular household waste. Tags are available at the Town Hall, Rec. Complex, Circle K, SPG, Mobil Gas and Canadian Tire for \$2.50 each. For details or more info, check our website at www.marathon.ca.
